



2019 Center for Aviation Studies Student Scholarships

The Center for Aviation Studies and the Aviation Alumni Society will be presenting a total of seven scholarships and awards at the Aviation Student Recognition and Awards Banquet on April 9, 2019. Please read the descriptions of each of these scholarships and complete the [online application](#). All applications are due by March 24, 2019 at 11:59pm.

All monetary scholarship funds will be awarded through the Student Financial Aid Office. The scholarship would be added to your Financial Aid Award Summary on Buckeye Link up to Cost of Attendance and disbursed to your Statement of Account. The funds would apply to any outstanding balance first and then excess funds would be refunded to you directly. It is anticipated that award winners will receive their scholarship funds prior to the end of April 2018.

The NetJets, Aviatrix, Kwon, and Engle Scholarship will not be processed through Student Financial Aid because they are used to cover travel expenses. Travel arraignments will be made by CAS by using a University travel request.

Description of the 2018 Aviation Student Scholarships

- **The NetJets Scholarship Fund Award (up to \$1,000 in travel funding)**, will be awarded to an aviation major with the focus of study in aviation management. Consideration for this award will be based on class standing (junior or senior), cumulative GPA (at least 3.0), and a response to the essay question. Recipient will be eligible to travel to an aviation industry conference or event that will enhance their academic pursuits.
- **Aviatrix Award (up to \$1,000 in travel funding)**, will be awarded to a female student aviation major or minor. Consideration for this award will be based on cumulative GPA (at least a 3.0), and a response to the essay question. Recipient will be eligible to travel to an aviation industry conference or event that will enhance their academic pursuits.
- **Hillsdale Collegiate Aviator Award (\$1,300)**, to be awarded to an aviation major pursuing the professional pilot specialization. Consideration for this award will be based on degree program (Aviation, Professional Pilot Specialization), cumulative GPA (at least 3.0), scores on FAA written exams (at least an 85 average), response to the essay question, and a recommendation from an Ohio State flight instructor.
- **Michael F. Engle Memorial Scholarship (up to \$1,000 in travel funding)**, to be awarded to an upperclassman with a declared aviation major and a member of the Alpha Eta Rho aviation fraternity. Consideration for this award will be based on class standing (junior or senior), cumulative



GPA (at least 3.0), and a response to the essay question. Recipient will be eligible to travel to an aviation industry conference or event that will enhance their academic pursuits.

- **John & Susan Herr Aviation Scholarship (\$1,000)**, to be given to an undergraduate student in good standing with the University, who has successfully completed their Private Pilot certificate. Consideration for this award will be based on cumulative GPA (at least 3.0), and a response to the essay question. Preference will be given to female aviation students.
- **The Warner & Mickey Wilson Endowment (\$1,500)**, to be awarded to a student majoring in aviation ranked sophomore or higher who has overcome adversity and shows financial need. Consideration for this scholarship will be based on the essay question clearly stating the adversity that was faced and the need for financial support.
- **Michael “33Echo” Kwon (\$1,033)**, to be awarded to an aviation student who is selected to participate in a study abroad program or internship based outside of Ohio with a completion date prior to the end of the 2019 spring semester. Funding will facilitate travel & relocation expenses, and is contingent upon being selected to participate in the study abroad program or internship. Response to the essay question should clearly state the name of the study abroad program or internship, organization/company, location, and dates of participation. Funding will be awarded once proof is shown of acceptance into a program.

Application Information

All scholarship applications must include a resume, an advising report, and response to an essay prompt. There is no length requirement on the essay, and the document will be uploaded as a part of this application.

Additional requirements for specific scholarships:

- NetJets, Engle, Kwon, and Aviatrix Scholarships: Trips must be selected prior to application, and you must briefly describe your plan for obtaining any additional funding that may be needed for the trip. Funds will be used during the travel request process.
- Hillsdale Scholarship: Recommendation letter from an Ohio State Flight Instructor.
- Kwon Scholarship: Funds will be dispersed once proof is shown of selection to attend a study abroad or internship.
